A brand new shop selling exclusive rustic goods and traditional craft items has just opened at Blists Hill Victorian Town in Madeley, near Ironbridge, Shropshire.

T.E.N Horsehay at Blists Hill is a shop run by adults with disabilities supported by Telford & Wrekin Council. Service users work in the shop, dressed in period costume, selling goods they have made at the workshop in Horsehay.

The goods include rustic benches, chairs and, rose arches, bird and bat boxes, as well as children's outdoor seats and more.

The shop was officially opened today by Cllr Andrew Eade, Leader of Telford & Wrekin Council and Steve Miller, Chief Executive of the Ironbridge Gorge Museum Trust. The shop is now open to the public visiting Blists Hill and is an exciting new development, which not only gives a much needed retail outlet for the products made by service users locally, but also an opportunity for people with disabilities to demonstrate traditional skills and be fully involved in the day-to-day life of the museum. This is an innovative venture between Telford & Wrekin Council and Ironbridge Gorge Museum Trust.

Blists Hill is one of the ten museum sites dotted around the World Heritage Site in Ironbridge. It transports you back to the Victorian era where you can visit the baker and buy fresh bread, make candles and a favourite for many is the traditional sweet shop.

T.E.N at Horsehay is part of Telford & Wrekin Council's Inclusive Education and Training service, which looks to support adults with disabilities to gain qualifications and develop skills for work in many areas such as customer care, IT, office skills, retail work and the production of rustic goods and craft items.

Steve Miller, Chief Executive of the Ironbridge Museum Trust, said: "I would really like to encourage residents and visitors to the area to come to Blists Hill, not only to enjoy the attraction as a whole but to take the opportunity to view and purchase some of the unique items made by local adults with disabilities."
